## D:side Workshops

Next week, years 1-6 will be taking part in a range of workshops across school to explore the theme of 'internet safety'. The workshops will be hosted by d:side and will take place on Monday 29<sup>th</sup> April, Tuesday 30<sup>th</sup> April and Wednesday 1<sup>st</sup> May. Below is an overview of what will be taught in class to give you the opportunity to support your child further at home.

Internet Safety Sessions for Key Stage's 1 and 2 will focus on:

- What we use the Internet for (KS1)
- What is / is not safe to share online (KS1)
- What to do if we are not sure about the internet (KS1)

- Using emails safely (KS2)
- Social networking and safe profiling including use of Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, Snap Chat, TikTok, etc. (KS2)
- 'chatting' with care (KS2)
- Responsible and safe use of the internet (logins, email, photography, password protection, personal information and self-protection). (KS2)
- Using text and picture messaging (KS2)
- Behaving responsibly (KS2)

### **Kooth**

Kooth online services can offer mental health support to children aged 10 and over.

- Their team of mental health professionals can provide mental health support within 15 minutes of contact. They offer:
- Free, anonymous support: their chat service is free, and you don't even have to give your name.
- Real people, not bots: the professionals you speak with in their chat service are real people who want to listen to you.
- A safe space to talk: the Kooth chat service is a safe space for support accredited by the British Association for Counselling and Psychology (BACP).

Kooth also has a bank of many activities and suggestions for supporting mental health and wellbeing both at home and at school. It is free to sign up and children can access resources and support immediately. Pease find the link to the Kooth website below:
