Homework and spellings

This week, the children have received their home learning on paper - an English task and a Maths activity.

Just a reminder again, each Monday, the children will come home with an activity based on a spelling rule which they need to return to school the following Monday. Each Monday, the children will be tested on 5 statutory unseen words and 5 words which adhere to the following weeks rule.

<u>This week's spelling rule</u> 'ei' words pronounced 'ee' e.g. receipt, deceit, deceive etc. <u>Statutory spellings</u>- Determined, Develop, Dictionary, Disastrous and Embarrass
