This week, the children have enjoyed reading poetry. We have read and discussed poems written by Laura Mucha. In writing, children have learned how to write a letter of complaint and we have already begun to draft our ideas. In maths, the children have been exploring fractions and have learned about unit fractions such as halves, quarters and thirds. We have also looked at some larger non-unit fractions which have more than one part selected. In history, children have talked about areas of interest in Leeds and we have looked at Temple Newsham, Harewood House, Kirkstall Abbey and Roundhay Park.

Go Read: If parents are using Go Read to log their child's reading please continue to do so. Spellings: Pupils have received new spelling homework. This week, we have explored the 's' sound within word spelt with 'ce'. It has also been uploaded to the Google Classroom.

Homework: This week, homework concentrates on fractions and reading comprehension.

Oxford Reading Buddy: This week children have brought home the passwords for the Oxford Reading Buddy. This is available online through any web browser. All books that have been allocated are in line with their current book band. Many books have an inbuilt reading coach to guide them through the comprehension of what they are reading. We would love pupils to use this when reading at home to help boost their reading fluency and understanding further.
