We have had another busy week this week and learned lots across all of the curriculum. In PSHE, we considered how setbacks help us to become resilient and to learn from these. We began learning the 1950's rock and roll classic, 'Rock Around The Clock' in Music and compared a North and South American city in Geography.

PE

Maths: This week, we have been working on multiplying and dividing by 10 and 100 using place value grids and counters to visualise this and secure our understanding. Next week, we will begin learning the formal written methods for 2 digit by 1 digit multiplication.

English: This week, we have drafted and published diary entries in role as Captain Robert Falcon Scott, using formal, historical language and powerful adjectives to describe emotions. We have also begun reading a range of funny poems and comparing their style and features. Next week, we will begin looking at the features of persuasive writing in order to write a travel brochure about an American city.

Homework: This week's homework task and spelling activity have been shared on Google Classroom. Spelling covers the /zh/ sound made with the codes 'ge' and 'g'. Homework tasks link to our learning from English and Maths this week.
