We have had another busy week this week and learned lots across all of the curriculum. In RE, we learned about the meaning of the Trinity in Christianity. We used glockenspiels to enhance our rock and roll music performances in Music and located the features of the landscape of South and North America in Geography.

<u>Maths:</u> This week, we have been working on dividing by 10 and 100 using place value grids and counters to visualise this and secure our understanding. We have also begun looking at ways to multiply a 2 digit by a 1 digit number. Next week, we will continue learning the formal written methods for 2 digit by 1 digit multiplication.

English: This week, we have begun analysing the features of a persuasive travel brochure. We have also begun reading 'Herstory', a non-fiction book featuring many inspirational women from history and celebrating their achievements. Next week, we will begin writing our travel brochures to persuade the reader to visit a North American city- New York.

Homework: This week's homework task and spelling activity have been shared on Google Classroom. Spelling covers the /u/ sound made with the codes 'ou' and 'ous'. Homework tasks link to our learning from English and Maths this week.
