The Robin Hood Cultural Capital Passport!

At Robin Hood Primary School, our aim is for our children to join us on a learning journey, which will equip them for their future. We want our children to leave us at Year 6 knowing how to be good citizens, have high aspirations, to be a resilient learner and have high levels

of enquiry skills. Cultural capital is the essential knowledge that children need to prepare them for their future success. It is about giving children the best possible start to their early education. Cultural Capital is not something that is 'given' or 'taught'. It is about culture, language, traditions and experiences. At Robin Hood all children take part in the Cultural Capital Passport Programme. Our programme includes the themes of;



- Arts and Culture
- Appreciation of Nature
- Local Community Links
- Physical and Practical Skills
- Educational Visits

As the children travel through school, they will embark on their learning journey, receiving stamps in their cultural capital passports for each experience they take part in. We aim for them to be ready to be world citizens by the time they leave year 6! This week our passports finally arrived! Remember, if you would like any further information on any of the lessons, or to see the lesson content in more detail, please speak to your class teacher as they will be able to provide this for you.

Some parents felt that they would like a clearer picture of the content taught across school.

Some parents were concerned about how age-appropriate the content is that is being taught.

Some elements of our PSHE/RSE curriculum are guided by the needs of our school, this may include topics such as bullying, communities and money. However, there are aspects of the curriculum that are statutory and must be taught in all Primary Schools.
