Nursery Newsletter – Friday 8th March 2024

This Week:

What a very busy week we have had in Nursery. We have made and tasted porridge like The Three Bears and all you lovely Mummies will be getting a lovely handmade surprise for Mother's Day. We have each planted an individual bean and are excited to see what happens to them over the next few weeks. We had a wonderful time celebrating World Book Day. The children all looked delightful in their costumes and we read lots of stories sharing our love of reading.

Home Learning: Wider Curriculum

As we are learning about flowers and parts of a plant can you please support your child in labelling a picture this week for your child to bring to Nursery to share. They can continue to care for the plants in your home and any flowers you may be lucky enough to receive for Mother's Day.

Next week

In Literacy, we will be reading the book 'Look flowers'. We will look at a range of common and exotic flowers from around the world. Whilst sharing the text and we will look at descriptive words for flowers and reinforce parts of a plant. We will be monitoring the beans we have planted and watching them grow ensuring we provide the food, love, water, sunlight and air we know they need to thrive.

Phonics: Next week in phonics we will be revisiting the book 'At the Wildlife Park'. The children will be once again focusing on Level 1 Aspect 6- vocal sounds. The children will continue to build on their listening skills as we progress through the half term.

Maths: In maths next week we will be investigating routes and locations. The children will learn how to draw a similar map using basic directions and adding familiar locations such as school and their home. The children will be encouraged to use directional language around the nursery setting.

Home Learning:

Reading – To read your phonics book at least 4 times a week, and your reading for pleasure book with a parent. Please bring your Reading Folder to school as follows:

MTW/30-hour - children bring books in on Monday and they will be sent home on a Wednesday

WTF - Children to bring in books on a Wednesday and they will be sent home on a Friday

Please remember to log the books we send home from school, on in your Reading Planner. It is optional to record any other books you share with your child. Thank you.

Reminders

- Nursery PE days are Mondays and Fridays. On these days, your child can come to school dressed in their PE kit (white t-shirt, black jogging bottoms or shorts, black or green jumper and trainers).
- Every day your child has the option of having a piece of snack (fruit or vegetable) provided by school, which they can enjoy in the Snack Café. Please feel free to send in an alternative piece of fruit or vegetable, if you wish.
- Water Bottles will remain in school and will be washed and refilled ready for your child every day.
- We are a Healthy School, therefore if you are sending your child with a packed lunch, please ensure you are providing a balanced, healthy lunch for your child.
