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## Home Schooling Information Pack

While school is shut, we advise parents and careers to ensure that learning continues to take place at home from Monday to Friday. We do not know at present when schools will re-open and it will be important for your child or children to continue to have as much routine and structure as possible to support them in their learning but also their emotional well-being.

This information pack will support you in home schooling your child or children in this incredibly difficult time. Your child will have access to web-based learning and will also be provided with an exercise book to put work in of any open-ended tasks you chose to do or any other learning you would like to share when your child or children return back at school. If you need any pens or pencils, please let school know and we can make sure they come home with some on Friday when they leave school.

### Google Classrooms

This will be a large part of communication between you, your child and your child's class teacher. All children from Reception to Year 6 have been assigned a google email which they can log on to. In this pack you will find a step by step guide on how to get on to Google classrooms. At 8:30am each morning your child's class teacher will post a suggested timetable for the day and share any work they may have set (Monday to Friday). Additional interaction will take place through-out the day based on this daily timetable. Mrs Passmoore our SENCO, will also be involved in each of the Google classrooms and alongside the paper based learning she is sending home she can also post directly online to a specific child in each class who may be following separate programmes or learning. We will treat the Easter Holidays as normal so this will not happen from Monday 7<sup>th</sup> April to Friday 24<sup>th</sup> April. If we are still in this situation after the holidays then the online learning will continue.

### Dojo's Rewards

As a school we feel it is important to continue to reward the children for any learning that they do whilst learning at home. From Monday 23<sup>rd</sup> March all teachers will be using an application called Dojo as a reward. This application has other facilities but as a school we will only be using it for rewards. When you sign in to the google classroom there will be a post which gives you more information on how to access the dojo application.

### Written or creative work

Please use the exercise book provided to put in any written or creative work. You can also send photos to your child's class teacher through their google email address of any writing you would like to share.

### Log ins

Your child will be sent home with all of their log ins and passwords. If your child or children have been given any new log ins, they have had practice in class this week logging on or off. If you have any problems with this, then please let school know.

### Handwriting

It is important your child, particularly in the younger year groups (Nursery to Year 3) practice their handwriting Monday to Friday. This can be through practicing a letter on its own, writing words on their own or writing short sentences.

## Twinkl

We would encourage all parents and carers to access Twinkl online; this is a regular resource used in school. Twinkl are providing everyone free access for the next month. Your child's class teacher will also use resources from this in the Google classroom.

## Websites school also use

Teachers will also have regular access to all of the other online programmes we use. Your teacher can view how often your child has logged on or completed work and can continue to add work as and when is necessary.

We appreciate that some of you will have more than one child or will also be in your own predicament of having to work from home. Please use the suggested timetable as you see fit and if you would like any advice or support during this testing time then you can email your child's class teacher through their Google email account which is provided. They will be happy to help you in supporting you as your child learns from home.

## IT support

In addition, our IT technician has created an address for parents or carers to use if they have any issues signing into any of your child's accounts. You will need to email [googlehelp@robinhood.leeds.sch.uk](mailto:googlehelp@robinhood.leeds.sch.uk) This will be checked daily.

 Google Classroom	<p><b><u>Google Classrooms (Reception to Year 6)</u></b> You can download the app 'google classrooms' on your phone, tablet or android. If you have an older version of an i-pad or tablet it may not be compatible but you will be able to access google classrooms through any internet search engine.</p>
	<p><b><u>Times Table Rock Stars (Year 1 to 6)</u></b> 15 – 20 minutes per day. Your child will have personalised times tables that they will be working on. As your child works through these your teacher can amend these so your child continues to move forward in their timetable knowledge.</p>
	<p><b><u>White Rose Maths Hub (Year 1 to 6)</u></b> This is used in school for Maths lesson. If you type in any internet search engine 'White Rose Maths Hub' they have prepared a series of five brand new maths lessons for each year group from Years 1-8 to support parents in home learning with their children. Every lesson comes with a short video showing you clearly and simply how to help your child to complete the activity successfully. Please have a look at this, it will really help you understand the Maths that your child would normally have at school.</p>
	<p><b><u>Reading book (All children)</u></b> Read for 10 - 20 minutes per day and record this in your child's Reading Record. Your child will be given a selection of books to take home, however, should they run out of these books to read, there are many online resources you can use at home to read amazing books online:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- <a href="#">Bug Club</a></li><li>- <a href="#">Epic Reading!</a></li><li>- <a href="#">World eBook</a></li></ul>
	<p><b><u>Epic Reading! (Reception to 6)</u></b> You can use this application to read an amazing selection of books online. Your child's class code is: Once they enter this on the 'families log in' page, they will be able to select their name. Once online, they can read books their teacher has suggested for them or they can explore the online library and choose a book for themselves.</p>
	<p><b><u>Phonics Play (All children)</u></b> Phonics Play is free during this time. Children can use the site at home without their parents needing to subscribe. To access their resources all you need to do is log on using the following details: Username: march20 Password: home</p>
	<p><b><u>Bug Club (Reception to Year 6)</u></b> Use the application for 10 – 20 minutes. Your child can either read books or play on any of the games set by the teacher which may be linked to a phonic sound.</p>
	<p><b><u>Purple Mash (Nursery to Year 6)</u></b> We encourage you as a parent to sign up to the Parent Portal. Your child's teacher may set some open ended tasks to do or your child can access the various games on English, Mathematics, Science, Computing, Art and Topics. Please see the separate letter attached with your child's log in details.</p>
	<p><b><u>Education City (Nursery to 6)</u></b> 30 minutes per day Your class teacher will have set work and games for your child to go on at home. These will continue to be added to as your child completes work.</p>
